Godfrey Bowen gains the world shearing record by shearing 456 sheep in a nine-hour working day.

DAMS AND DYNAMITE. 522 ft.

At the site of the Whakamaru power station, on the Waikato River, an 800-ft. concrete diversion cut is prepared to carry the waters of the river while the massive dam is built. Diverting the river through the cut is effected by two spectacular explosions.

NEW ZEALANDERS IN KOREA.

New Zealand servicemen in Korea. Gunners combine with Royal Australian Air Force jet planes in bombarding enemy positions. A fire in Pusan city adds thousands to those Koreans being housed and fed by relief organisations. H.M.N.Z.S. Hawea patrols Korea's coast, and shells enemy shore installations. New Zealand gunners on leave see Tokyo and other parts of Japan.

Christmas supplies go up to the Battery area in Korea, where the turkeys and other palatables are cooked in a Hangi, or Maori oven, by Maori soldiers. Following tradition, Christmas dinner is served by the officers, while the war goes on. (Item first issued in "Pictorial Parade No. 3")

WORLD RECORD SHEARING. 198 ft.

Godfrey Bowen shears 456 sheep in a nine-hour working day, and gains the world shearing record.

THE GEOTHERMAL BORES. 385 ft.

The Karapiti blow-hole, and steam bores and equipment in the Wairakei geyser region. Sir John Cockroft's visit to Wairakei, and the blowing of a new steam bore to supply power for a big pulp and paper mill.
